Bearcats Open Much Anticipated 2007-08 Season at St. Bonaventure

The Binghamton men's basketball team opens the 2007-08 regular season on Monday when it visits Olean, N.Y. to take on Atlantic-10 opponent St. Bonaventure. Tipoff is scheduled for 7 p.m. EST at the Reilly Center. With two all-stars and seven letterwinners back on the floor, a highly-respected coaching staff in the fold, Binghamton basketball heads into the season opener brimming with excitement.

St. Bonaventure returns six players from a 2006-07 squad that finished 7-22 and 4-12 in the A-10. The Bonnies are led by seniors Michael Lee and Zarryon Fereti. Lee, a 6-9 forward, averaged 12.9 points per game and 6.2 rebounds to lead the Bonnies last season. Fereti, a 6-3 guard, came off the bench last year to finish third on the team in scoring at 12.1 points per game. The Bonnies open their season Nov. 9 against America East opponent Boston University.

NEXT UP: Coach Broadus and the Bearcats return to Vestal for Wednesday evening's home opener against Quinnipiac. Tip-off is set for 7 p.m.

PREGAME NOTEBOOK

- Binghamton returns three starters and seven letterwinners from a 13-16 team that placed sixth (out of nine) in the America East and was eliminated in the conference tournament quarterfinals.

- First-year coach **Kevin Broadus** signed with Binghamton three days after helping lead the Georgetown Hoyas to the NCAA Final Four. Broadus coached at Georgetown for three years and before that, helped build a George Washington program for three years.

- Leading the way for the Bearcats is senior point guard **Mike Gordon**. A Preseason All-America East Team choice, Gordon averaged 11.0 ppg, 4.5 apg, and led the America East Conference in steals (1.6 spg) and assist-to-turnover ratio last year and was named a second-team all-star and to the all-defensive team.

- Gordon is complemented by **Lazar Trifunovic**, who averaged 10.9 ppg and 6.5 rpg last year. One of the conference's most productive newcomers, Trifunovic established school freshman records for scoring, rebounding, field goals, and field goal percentage garnering conference all-rookie honors.

- Senior guard **Richard Forbes** torched ACC member Miami for 27 points in BU's 79-74 upset of the Hurricanes last December 18. Forbes, the team's most explosive offensive player and leading returning scorer, scored 15 or more points nine times. With just one start last season, Forbes (11.3 ppg.) ranked among the nation's top-10 for sixth man scoring, reaching as high as No. 6 in mid-February. In high school in NYC, Forbes led the PSAL in scoring — ahead of NBA player Sebastian Telfair.

- The Bearcats were picked to finish fourth in the America East Conference preseason coaches' poll.

- BU enters Monday's opener with a 30-31 (.491) all-time record in season openers, including a 2-4 mark in its Division I era. (joined in the 2001-02 season). After winning its first two DI season openers, BU has dropped its first contest in each of the last four seasons.

ALL-STAR GORDON LEADS WAY

Mike Gordon had a superb year for the Bearcats in 2006-07. The then-junior guard from Plainfield, N.J. led the team in minutes played, assists, steals, assist-to-turnover ratio, three-point field goals made and percentage while starting every game and scoring 10.9 points per contest. Gordon also received all-conference second team honors and all-defensive team honors. Gordon was also a clutch player as he had three game-winning shots, two being buzzer beaters. Gordon moved into first place on the Division I record list for both career assists (289) and career steals (144). Gordon is also ranked in the top-ten in career points, rebounds, field goals made and three-point field goals made.

FOREIGN FLAVOR

Binghamton University is proud of its reputation as a welcoming campus for international students. Last year, BU hosted 1,523 students from 99 countries, pursuing undergraduate and graduate degrees. Nowhere is that diversity more apparent than the men's basketball roster. *Binghamton has players from six different countries (Bosnia, Canada, Cameroon, France, Serbia, United States) and a total of seven players that were born outside the United States. No other Division I men's program has as many countries represented on its roster or as many players born outside the U.S.*

ALL-TIME RECORD

Binghamton brings an all-time record of 562 wins and 776 losses into the 2007-08 season, the 62nd in the school's basketball history and the seventh in its Division I era.

MOVING ON UP

Mike Gordon begins his race for 1,000 career points in 2007-08. Gordon enters the season needing 352 points to become BU's 18th all-time member of the school's 1,000 point club. Last season, former guard Troy Hailey '07 became the first Bearcat to reach the milestone in the school's DI era. Gordon currently sits in sixth on the school's DI scoring list.

Kevin Broadus, Binghamton University Men's Basketball Coach

Kevin Broadus begins his first season as the head coach of the Binghamton basketball program in 2007-08. Broadus is the 11th head coach in Binghamton's 60 years of basketball and the second since the school made the jump to Division I in 2001. He takes over the Bearcats after spending the last three years as an assistant coach for Georgetown.

At Georgetown, Broadus worked alongside head coach John Thompson III, and the Hoyas' recent national resurgence is a direct result of his recruiting success in the D.C. metro area. Last year's squad went 30-7 and won both the regular season and postseason Big East titles before advancing through the first four rounds of the NCAA tournament to the Final Four. The 2005-06 team went 23-10 and reached the NCAA "Sweet 16" and the 2004-05 team went 19-13 and advanced to the NIT quarterfinals.

Broadus was introduced as Binghamton's new head coach on March 26, 2007, just days before coaching Georgetown in the Final Four. Also, in the same month he was ranked No. 6 by on-line publication *hoopscooponline.com* on their list of the *Top 100 Assistant Coaches in the College Game Today*.

Prior to Georgetown, Broadus was an assistant coach at George Washington for three years. In 2003-04, his Colonials team won 18 games and was selected to the NIT. From 1998 to 2001, he was on the staff at American University and also had coaching stints at University of the District of Columbia (1994-97) and Bowie State University (Md.) (1990-93).

Broadus is known as an excellent recruiter and four of his former recruits are playing in the NBA. Three of his players from his time at George Washington were on NBA rosters in the 2006-07 season. Mike Hall played for the Washington Wizards, Pops Mensah-Bonsu played for the Dallas Mavericks and Danilo 'JR' Pinnock was with the Los Angeles Lakers.

Broadus' most-accomplished recruit is former Georgetown forward Jeff Green. He coached Green over a three-year span in which Green won Big East Co-Rookie of the Year honors, Big East second-team all-conference honors and the Big East Player of the Year award. Green and Broadus' Hoyas had a 30-7 record in 2006-07 and made it to the NCAA Final Four. Green was drafted fifth overall in the 2007 NBA draft by the Boston Celtics and was involved in a draft day trade, shipping him to Seattle.

Broadus earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from Bowie State in 1990 and went on to receive his master's degree in counseling from UDC in 1995.

He was a three-year letterwinner at Bowie State, earning conference all-rookie honors in 1984 and leading the team in scoring as team captain in his senior season. He played his first collegiate season at Grambling University in Louisiana. Broadus attended Dunbar High School in Washington, D.C. and Montgomery Blair High School in Silver Spring, Md.

In addition to his college coaching resume, Broadus has worked as a summer camp coach and counselor for both the Philadelphia 76ers and the New York Knicks. He also served four years as a research assistant at the National Institute of Health in Bethesda.

Broadus and his wife, Belinda, have four children: Nicol (23), Milan (14), Paris (13) and Kevin Jr. (11).

SCHEDULE NOTES

• The 2006-07 non-conference schedule features two games against NCAA tournament teams (George Washington, Central Connecticut State) and three teams that won 20 or more games (G.W., CCSU and Akron). Akron went 26-7 and was runnerup in the Mid-American Conference, just missing an NCAA tournament berth. George Washington, where Broadus served as assistant coach from 2001-04, went 23-9 and won the Atlantic-10 title. Central Connecticut State won the Northeast Conference regular season and tournament titles and went 22-12 overall.

• The 2006-07 non-conference schedule is a 12-game slate (plus ESPN Bracketbuster game) with opponents from six different conferences. Binghamton opens and closes their non-conference schedule against St. Bonaventure. The Bearcats will play away against the Bonnies on Nov. 12, and closes their schedule at home against them on Dec. 30. Seven of the 10 non-conference opponents played .500 or better last season and five of those teams finished in the top-three in their league. In addition, three teams won 20 or more games a year ago. The overall conference record of BU's 10 opponents was 88-58 (60%).

• Other teams that fared well in their conferences were Cornell (16-12, third in Ivy), Fordham (18-12, fourth in A-10) and Quinnipiac (third in Northeast). The Dec. 28 game at Fordham will be the first-ever game against the Rams.

• The schedule also includes return matchups with 2006-07 opponents Rider (Dec. 1) and Colgate (Dec. 5) and a home-and-home series with independent Chicago State (Nov. 17 away and Dec. 22 at home).

• For the first time, the Bearcats were selected to participate in the sixth annual O'Reilly ESPNU BracketBusters series, which will be televised on ESPN2, ESPNU and ESPN Classic on Friday and Saturday, February 22-23. The Bearcats will join fellow America East schools Albany, Boston University and Vermont in the two-day, 50-game event, which typically features prominent teams from mid-major conferences. Binghamton's game will be an away contest, with the Bearcats hosting that same team at the Events Center during the 2008-09 season.
